









WHAT IS A MOBILITY HUB?


Brings together an intensive concentration of work, live, shop and play experiences that are comfortably accessible by foot











HIGH PRIORITY AMENITIES/INCENTIVES TO ENCOURAGE USE OF PUBLIC TRANSIT




